- CV \$2,500 and \$2,750 respectively



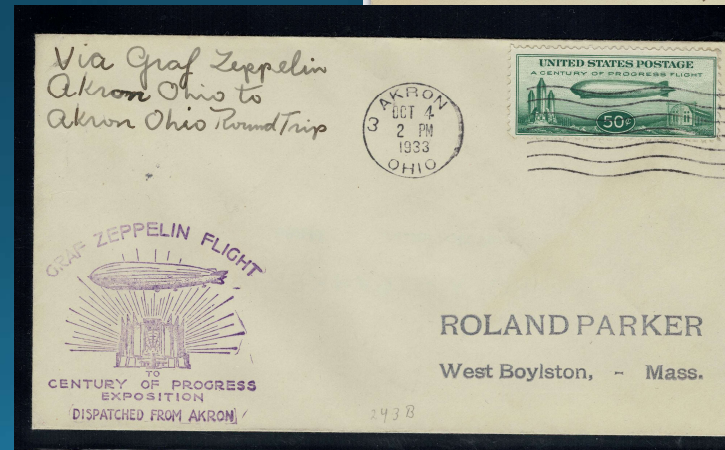

20th Universal Postal Congress



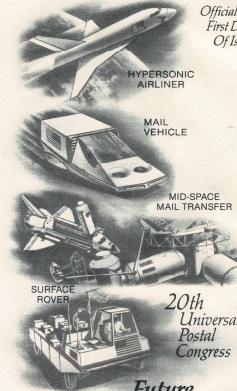
